THE PUBLIC WORKS MAINTENANCE MECHANIC

Essential Duties

The following duties are typical for the Public Works Maintenance Mechanic, but are not intended to reflect all duties performed within the job.

Perform routine to complex mechanical work in the maintenance, repair, overhauling, and/or rebuilding of vehicles, equipment, components, pumps, valves, electrical motors, and engines including but not limited to pressure relief valves and pressure reducing stations.

Perform routine to complex preventative mechanical maintenance by inspecting and cleaning equipment, changing out lubricating fluids, repacking bearings, adjusting and replacing belts, gear boxes, pistons, filters, valves, gaskets, and other related parts.

Rebuild a wide variety of equipment by disassembling, cleaning, and repairing mechanical malfunctions; reassemble and test equipment to ensure that it is in proper working condition.

Respond to Public Works emergencies and problems as required; make emergency field repairs, respond to after-hour emergencies when called upon to do so.

Qualifications

Education/Training: Requires sufficient experience and education to successfully perform the duties of a journey-level Public Works Maintenance Mechanic in a municipal agency. A typical way of obtaining the qualifications is to possess the equivalent of five years of experience in the repair and maintenance of mechanical and electrical equipment such as pumps, motors, valves, and engines.

Knowledge: Requires knowledge of operations, services, and activities of water and wastewater facilities, lift, and pumping stations; methods, techniques, tools, equipment, and materials used in the maintenance and repair of large pumps and motors utilized in water, wastewater and street maintenance operations; electrical theory related to the repair of pumps, motors, and related equipment; operating and maintaining a variety of hand and power tools and equipment; principles and practices of record-keeping; and occupational hazardous and standard safety practices.

Ability to: Perform a variety or routine to complex repair, maintenance, servicing, and cleaning tasks involving pumps, motors, valves, and pressure regulating stations; troubleshoot, repair, and maintain a variety of routine to complex mechanical equipment in the Corporation Yard; diagnose and repair a variety of mechanical and drivability problems associated with gasoline and diesel-driven equipment.

The City of Placerville is seeking a journey-level Maintenance Mechanic to perform all repairs and maintenance at the Corporation Yard and in City streets and easements including water and wastewater lift and pumping stations, and pressure relief valves. The Maintenance Mechanic will perform a variety of routine to complex preventative and corrective maintenance on a wide variety of vehicles, pumps, valves, engines, and other equipment related to water, wastewater and street maintenance.

License or Certificate: Possession of, or ability to obtain by date of appointment, an appropriate driver's license. Possession of a Grade II Water Distribution Operator Certificate or the ability to obtain the Certificate within one year of appointment.

Physical Demands and Working Environment: In the Corporation Yard and field environment, the incumbent will be exposed to noise, dust, grease, fumes, gases, potentially hazardous chemicals, electrical energy, and inclement weather conditions including wet and/or humid conditions; work around water or wastewater; regularly work near moving mechanical parts.
