5.1 Authorize the Mayor to Send a Letter to the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors Regarding the Proposed Perks Court Homeless Navigation Center, Encouraging the County to Move Forward with the Project (Mr. Morris)

The City Manager provided background on the item and the Chief of Police summarized several concerns addressed in his letter. The Mayor read comments from Vice-Mayor Saragosa, unable to attend the meeting. Public comment was received from Michael Buehler, Maryanne Buehler, David Zelinsky, Sue Rodman, Maureen Dion-Perry, Peg Vanderkar, Don Vanderkar, Jane McGinnis, Kathi Lishman, Margaret Lewis, Martin Entwistle, Ruth Michelson, Art Edwards, Sheryl Trainor, Marty Knight, Leslie Hill, Jessie Jessen, Diane Rabinowitz, and Margie Lopez-Read.

Following Council discussion, it was moved by Councilmember Borelli that the City Council authorize the Mayor to send a letter to the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors regarding the proposed Perks Court homeless navigation center, encouraging the County to move forward with the project, and in the letter, include language reaffirming the City's opposition to Pierroz Rd. as a viable location; state that the homeless issue is a county-wide problem, not a city problem, that the impact on emergency medical services and the hospital will continue, and after numerous unanimous or 4-1votes, it is inappropriate to change course on the matter at this time. The City Council will also include the letter from the Chief of Police and comments from the public.
