**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE
RATIFYING A RESTRICTED GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF
CALIFORNIA FOR THE SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES GRANT IN THE
AMOUNT OF \$167,634 FOR THE CEDAR RAVINE ROAD MULTIMODAL STUDY
PROJECT (CIP #42422), APPROVING BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS TOTALING
\$189,353 THE SAID PROJECT, AND AUTHORIZING STAFF TO RELEASE A
REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE SAID
PROJECT**

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2023 the City received authorization to begin the work associated with the grant funds for the state Sustainable Communities Grant Program for the Cedar Ravine Road Multimodal Study; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to procure consulting services to perform a planning-level study to evaluate existing conditions and propose alternatives to improve multimodal transportation and connectivity on Cedar Ravine Road between Main Street and Lions Park:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Placerville does hereby:

1. Ratify a restricted grant agreement with the State of California for Sustainable Communities Grant in the amount of \$167,634 for the Cedar Ravine Road Multimodal Study project (CIP #42422); and
2. Approve budget appropriations in state Sustainable Communities Grant funds in the amount of \$167,634 and a local match in the amount of \$21,719 in Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account unassigned funds for the said project; and
3. Authorizing staff to release a Request for Proposals for consulting services for the said project.
