**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE
AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY SERVICES TO
NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH NATIONAL AQUATICS
SERVICES, INC. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$11,374.38 FOR ACTIVITY POOL
PUMP REPAIR PROJECT (CIP #42510) AND APPROVING A \$14,000 BUDGET
APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND CONTINGENCY FOR
UNFORESEEN EXPENDITURES FOR THE SAID PROJECT**

WHEREAS, the Placerville Aquatics Center is a vital community recreational hub, providing affordable, safe, and ADA-accessible aquatic programs for youth, families, seniors, and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the activity pool, a key component of the 20-year-old facility, requires immediate pump repairs costing \$11,374.38 to ensure its reopening for the 2025 season, which began on June 2, 2025, to meet participant demand; and

WHEREAS, this repair addresses critical infrastructure needs, supporting the City's strategic plan to maintain and update city-owned infrastructure, ensuring safe and reliable recreational opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Placerville hereby:

1. Authorize the Director of Community Services to negotiate and execute a contract with National Aquatics Services, Inc. in the amount of \$11,374.38 for the Activity Pool Pump Repair project (CIP #42510); and
2. Approve a \$14,000 budget appropriation from the General Fund Contingency for Unforeseen Expenditures for the said project.
