During his tenure, many projects have been designed and constructed including the repaving and beautification of Main Street, the Western Placerville Interchange projects, Broadway Maintenance and Sidewalks projects, the new Placerville Station II Park and Ride, the repaving of Mosquito Road, the new Pickle Ball Courts at Lions Park, and establishing a new broadband utility just to name a few. Cleve was also a major contributor in establishing the Rise and Shine Day of Service event that brings the Community together each year to help spruce up the City's facilities, parks, and trails.


