- 3. Broadband Service Kevin Brown, Mickey Kaiserman, Andrew Vonderschmitt. Mr. Morris updated the Committee on status.
- b. Civic Lab Proposal for Broadway Review results of meetings and survey for design of streetscape improvements on Broadway: Mr. Morris gave a report on the Civic Lab's \$20,000 Broadway Village Corridor Landscape and Gateway Treatments project, including the public survey and the draft Local Government Commission (LGC) recommendations.
 - Mr. Morris updated the Committee on the grant program and the public survey.
- c. Consider recommendation for Green Zone: Mr. Morris briefed the Committee on SACOG's Green Zone program. Mr. Morris explained the proposed boundaries to include the Broadway corridor from Mosquito east to the City limits. It was moved by Member Kaiserman, and seconded by Member Vonderschmitt, to create an ad-hoc subcommittee to assist City staff with completion of the Green Zone application. Motion carried 6-0. The Committee agreed that Members Vonderschmitt, Thomas, and Wager to serve on the subcommittee.

- a. Update Hotel Projects:
 - Gateway Hotel. Partner Developer: Mr. Morris briefed the Committee stated that the developer has found a new partner, Eat, Drink, and Sleep, and that a scheduled meeting was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic and has not been rescheduled. Mr. Rivas briefed the Committee on his discussion with John Reed, a hotel developer who is interested in the hotel site.
- b. Historic City Hall Reuse: No update.
- c. Cannabis Dispensaries Update: Mr. Morris updated the Committee stating that three licenses have been awarded and two applicants not receiving a license have threatened suing the City.
- d. COVID-19 Update: No update.
- e. Chair Miller asked for an update on the proposal to close Main Street. Mr. Morris stated that staff has not yet brought the proposal to City Council.
