



**Notice of Placerville City Council

301 Main Street - Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 20-06

Placerville City Council will conduct a public hearing on **Monday, January 11, 2021, 3:00 p.m.**, to consider an appeal filed by Mark Acuna on the November 17, 2020 decision of the Placerville Planning Commission to approve the project, **301 Main Street - CUP20-06**, is categorically exempt from CEQA per Guidelines Section 15303(c), which approved the operation of a place of entertainment use at 301 Main Street, Placerville, located in the Central Business District.
