INVESTIGATIONS/CRIME REDUCTION TEAM

Investigations 2023 open case load is currently 17. The Crime Reduction Team consists of a sergeant and two detectives to meet the needs of the department and the community.

The daily duties and responsibilities of the CRT varies greatly, but can be summed up as encompassing warrant arrests, case follow-up, rapid response to crime-related tips and self-initiated investigations.

Crime Reduction Team and Investigations – Notable Activity

- CRT coordinated with allied agencies and HHS for Upper Broadway Dr. Outreach for the entire month of March. 26 individuals were contacted, with the focus of identifying those that are camping in the area. Numerous individuals were assisted in entering the Navigation Center and others that refused the services. Three individuals were cited and four were arrested for trespassing. The known areas for camping were checked for tents and five were located. Quartz Mountain area was clear of all tents.
- CRT working multiple gas thefts on Placerville Dr. (Thompsons GMC)
- CRT conducted an ABC Grant operation “Minor Decoy”. The Decoy purchased an alcoholic beverage at two retailers. 14 other retail stores were attempted to make an alcohol purchase and the decoy was refused.
- CRT made a felony arrest at 299 Placerville Dr. (Navigation Center) for negligently setting a fire in their room.
