The efforts by all those involved in National Night Out 2020 were recognized by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) when they awarded Placerville 2nd place in the nation for our category. NATW reviewed submissions from all over the county after the October 6, 2020 event. This year was the 37th annual NNO that involved over 16,000 communities nationwide.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the NNO planners had to think outside the box. Our "kickoff" event was located at the Bell Tower, which featured a live podcast hosted by Chaplain Al Soto, of Bayside Church, Matt Morecraft, of Bayside Church and Justin Nida.

Eleven local restaurants signed up to participate and offered NNO "meal deals". These restaurants included Amerikan Ichi, Amore Mio, Dickey's Barbeque Pit, Paco's Mexican Cuisine, Pizza Factory, Placerville Public House, Powell's Steamer Co. & Pub, Sourdough & Co. Spanky's Pizza, Teriyaki Junction and Tijuana Taqueria.

A scrapbook with all the pictures from the parties and events leading up to NNO was completed and submitted to NATW for the award process.

"NNO is the highlight of our community policing efforts each year and we are proud to work with the community to create an award winning event."
