

**A Proclamation of the City Council
of the City of Placerville Declaring May 29, 2017,
as Memorial Day at the El Dorado County Veterans Monument**

- WHEREAS:** For over two centuries, brave men and women have laid down their lives in defense of our great Nation and on this Memorial Day, we honor the generations of Americans who have fought and died to defend our freedom; and
