A PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE DECLARING APRIL 2019 AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS: Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and has public health and safety implications for the City of Placerville and beyond; and

WHEREAS: Rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment harm our community, and statistics show one in five women and one in 67 men will be raped at some point in their lives (Smith et al., 2017); and

WHEREAS: Child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one in six boys and one in four girls will experience sexual assault before age 18 (Dube et al., 2005); and

WHEREAS: On campus, one in five women and one in sixteen men are sexually assaulted during their time in college (Krebs, Lindquist, Warner, Fisher, & Martin, 2007); and

WHEREAS: The goal of Sexual Assault Awareness Month is more than awareness – the ultimate goal is prevention of sexual harassment, abuse and assault; and

WHEREAS: When we talk about prevention, we mean stopping sexual violence before it happens by changing norms that allow it to exist in the first place from attitudes, values and behaviors to laws, institutions, and widespread social norms; and

WHEREAS: We call on our community to join us in the "I ASK" campaign and champion the power of asking and receiving consent; and "I ASK" is the statement by which individuals will demonstrate that asking for consent is a healthy, normal, and necessary part of everyday interactions will uplift the importance of consent and transform it from being prescriptive to empowering; and

WHEREAS: Prevention is everyone's responsibility: All of us can create and promote safe environments. We can intervene to stop behavior, promote healthy attitudes and relationships, believe survivors, and assist them in finding resources; and

WHEREAS: We strongly support the efforts of national, state, and local sexual assault prevention programs and rape crisis centers in their efforts to create safe and healthy communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Mark A. Acuna, Mayor of the City of Placerville, do hereby join The Center for Violence-Free Relationships and communities across the country in playing an active role to prevent sexual violence. Along with the United States Government, the State of California, and El Dorado County, I do hereby proclaim April 2019 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in the City of Placerville.
