## A PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLACERVILLE TO HONOR THE SERVICE OF INTERIM EL DORADO COUNTY FIRE CHIEF LLOYD OGAN

**WHEREAS,** the City of Placerville honors the service of Interim El Dorado County Fire Chief Lloyd Ogan; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, Chief Ogan was an R.O.P. student in Rancho Cordova; and

**WHEREAS,** in 1983 Chief Ogan was hired as a full-time Firefighter/Engineer with Natomas Fire Protection District; and

**WHEREAS,** in the years between 1984 and 2015, Chief Ogan rose up through the ranks of the Sacramento City Fire Department, retiring as the Deputy Chief of Operations; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2018 Chief Ogan came out of retirement to lead the El Dorado County Fire District until a new Chief could be named; and

**WHEREAS,** Chief Ogan's dedicated assistance to the City and local volunteers helped establish the Wildfire Vegetation Ordinance and the creation of the Placerville Fire Safe Council, both helping to protect and improve Placerville for years to come; and

WHEREAS, Chief Ogan's endless support during the 2019 PG&E PSPS events, including supplying weather and historical wildfire data to PG&E leadership during every PSPS event in October and November 2019, was invaluable. His efforts built a body of evidence disproving PG&E's concerns and the need to shut off power in Central El Dorado County. It was Chief Ogan's insistence to meet immediately on site with PG&E leadership in November that stopped a fifth needless PSPS outage:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Placerville, State of California, we offer our gratitude to Chief Ogan for his tireless dedication and exemplary leadership to both the El Dorado County Fire District and the City of Placerville over the past year.
